The operating budgets will then be further verified by viewing organizations' public 990 Forms.

Section II: Who May Apply, Pg. 7 of RFA	<p>If a CBO currently does not bill Medicaid and we sign them on for the project, but then later in the year starts to bill Medicaid... are they still eligible to be recruited?</p> <p>We have spoken to a few CBOs that would like to be involved and currently do not bill Medicaid, but know that they will start to bill Medicaid in the spring. We have told them that we need to get clarification on their eligibility.</p> <p>We expect that through our TA sessions and learning collaboratives, some CBOs may learn that they want to start billing Medicaid or start that process as they further understand how they fit into VBP.</p>	If the organization does not bill Medicaid, they are eligible to apply. However, if they are a HCBS provider who will be billing in the future, they are not eligible. Support activities were previously provided through MCTAC.
