Health Systems

Q3: Under section 2. Health Systems (page 13) may community pharmacies practices advanced enhanced (clinical) services be considered “other clinical settings.” We have a very innovative approach of a sector of health care professionals that are repositioning themselves to better participate in population health initiatives.

A3: The list of health care organizations provided on page 13 in the RFA is not exhaustive and is meant only to provide a limited number of examples. Yes, community pharmacies with enhanced services could be considered one of the clinical settings.

Q4: Page 13 - The section that asked regarding the Year 1 commitment- are three Primary Care Practice sites and other clinical sites with examples of Emergency, Urgent care required?

A4: Per the RFA (page 13) the applicant must recruit a minimum of 3 high asthma burden primary care sites or other clinical settings such as emergency department, urgent care, and school-based health center sites to engage in quality improvement activities in Year 1.

Q5: Page 13 - Question, Inpatient hospital clinical setting is not listed as an example; is a hospital health system inpatient project an acceptable project for inclusion in the proposal?

A5: The list of strategic partnerships provided in the RFA is not exhaustive and is meant to provide examples. Yes, inpatient hospital clinical setting is acceptable for inclusion.

Q6: Page 13 - Are 3 additional sites required to be identified for Years 2, 3, 4? Or is the process for recruitment of these practices an acceptable strategy for fulfilling this need? If so, where would that best be included?

A6: Letters of commitment for currently identified additional partnerships anticipated in Years 2-4 should also be included with the application, in Pre-submission uploads to demonstrate existing and potential plans for partnerships when possible. However, additional sites may be identified over the course of the contract; all sites need to be approved by DOH.
